

## WITHLACOOCHEE CHAPTER

Minutes of Meeting held on September 10, 2022

Meeting was called to order at 10:30 AM by President David Hitchcock.

Invocation by Pastor Linthicum.

Pledge of Allegiance was given by all.

The SAR Pledge and American Creed was stated by all.

President David introduced the speaker a Mark Barrie an award-winning author that writes historical fiction on various American wars including the Revolutionary War. He gave a very entertaining speech on the trivia, tidbits and little-known facts of the Revolutionary War. Mark's speech was well received by the Chapter. Meeting was adjourned at 11:50 AM for lunch.

Motion made and seconded to add \$5 to the cost of the shirt which would be returned as a donation to the Chapter. Motion passed unanimously. A third motion was made and seconded to use \$150 of chapter funds to fund the establishment of a storefront on our website to facilitate this process and all the donations up to \$150 will go to repay our original cost to establish the storefront. After that donations will go back to the Chapter. Motion passed unanimously.

**Old business:** Two upcoming events in Hernando County and Citrus County discussed starting at 4:00 PM in both counties. Participation by members would be appreciated.
